JOINT DOCTRINE DEVELOPMENT

References: See Enclosure B.

1. Purpose. This instruction establishes policy and assigns responsibilities for National Guard (NG) participation in joint doctrine development in accordance with (IAW) reference a.
2. Cancellation. This instruction cancels and replaces its previous version, CNGBI 7000.01, 26 September 2016, "Joint Doctrine Development."
3. Applicability. This instruction applies to the National Guard Bureau (NGB) Joint Staff, Army National Guard and Air National Guard Directorates, and National Guard Joint Force Headquarters-State (NG JFHQs-State).
4. Policy. It is NG policy to ensure NG equities are incorporated into joint doctrine and to support the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff (CJCS) in developing joint doctrine IAW references a through p.
 - a. Joint doctrine development guides the fundamental principles for employment of United States (U.S.) military forces in unified action to achieve unity of effort.
 - b. Joint doctrine enhances the operational and tactical effectiveness of the NGB, NG of the States, Territories, the District of Columbia, and NG JFHQs-State offices and their units by providing a common approach to operations.
 - c. Joint doctrine standardizes terminology, training, relationships, responsibilities, and processes for U.S. forces by providing the Joint Force Commander, NG JFHQs-State, Joint Task Force-State and their staffs the means to solve operational and tactical-level problems.

ENCLOSURE A
RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Director of the Army National Guard (DARNG), Director of the Air National Guard (DANG), National Guard Bureau, Director of Space Operations (NGB-DSO), National Guard Bureau Director of Staff (NGB-DS), The Adjutants General and the Commanding General of the District of Columbia NG. The DARNG, DANG, NGB-DSO, NGB-DS, The Adjutants General, and the Commanding General of the District of Columbia will:

- a. Support the joint doctrine development process IAW with references a and e.
- b. Provide analysis of exercise inputs, real-world operations, and experiments.
- c. Respond to assessment process feedback requests.
- d. Review, analyze, and evaluate joint publication drafts for technical accuracy and relevance.
- e. As an active participant in the joint doctrine development process, ensure NG equities are reflected during the development of joint doctrine.

2. Director of Operations (NGB-J3/4/7). The Director of NGB-J3/4/7 will:

- a. Serve as NGB's representative to the Joint Doctrine Development Community IAW references a and e.
- b. Oversee NG contributions to the joint doctrine development process IAW reference e.
- c. Promote NG States, Territories, and District of Columbia joint doctrine program awareness, development, and participation.

3. Chief of the Joint Training and Exercise Division (NGB-J37). The Chief of NGB-J37 will:

- a. Execute the NGB's joint doctrine development program in coordination with the CJCS Directorate for Joint Force Development.
- b. Act as the NGB agent for representing NG positions and equities on joint doctrine to the Joint Doctrine Development Community.
- c. Manage the NGB's joint doctrine development program.
- d. Ensure joint doctrine is consistent with existing capabilities.

e. Establish policies and procedures for developing joint doctrine and terminology IAW references a and e.

f. Solicit participation of NG States, Territories, and District of Columbia in joint doctrine development, review, and revision.

g. Ensure NG capabilities, roles, and tactics are accurately described in joint doctrine, as required.

PART II. DEFINITIONS

Joint Doctrine -- Fundamental principles that guide the employment of United States military forces in coordinated action toward a common objective, and may include tactics, techniques, and procedures.

Joint Doctrine Development Community -- The Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; Joint Staff; Combatant Commands; Services; National Guard Bureau; combat support agencies; National Defense University; United States Element, North American Aerospace Defense Command; and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff-controlled activities.

Joint Doctrine Development System -- The system of lead agents, Joint Staff doctrine sponsors, primary review authorities, coordinating review authorities, technical review authorities, assessment agents, Joint Doctrine Planning Conferences, procedures, and the hierarchical framework designed to initiate, develop, approve, and maintain joint publications.

Joint Publication -- A compilation of agreed-to fundamental principles, considerations, and guidance on a particular topic approved by the Chairman of the Joint Staffs of Staff, or authorized designee, that guides the employment of a joint force toward a common objective.
